

Make March Less Stressful for Birds

Simply put, March can be a very difficult month for your birds.

Birds' natural food supply is at its lowest point of the year. Insect populations are still low, and the few remaining wild fruits, berries, seeds and nuts are either hidden or undesirable. Unpredictable weather doesn't make life any easier. Sunny, warm, spring-like days can turn into cold, damp conditions that challenge birds' survival skills. And to make matters worse, this is all happening as some birds prepare for nesting season.

However, these various challenges provide you with a wonderful opportunity to help your birds.

Offer your birds lots of high-energy foods, such as peanuts and suet. Loaded with fat and protein, these are beneficial substitutes for the scarce insects many birds would eat if they could find them.

Counteract the lack of natural insects by offering protein-rich mealworms. They're eaten by numerous bird species and can be a lifesaver during a sudden cold snap.

Bird houses can make your birds' lives a little easier. After all, they have already expended a lot of energy establishing territories, courting and looking for scarce food.

Nesting season has already began in Northern California. Chickadees and Titmice are in full courtship now, but it's not too late to put out a nest box. Other local birds that will readily use one include: woodpeckers, nuthatches, bluebirds, wrens, swallows, flycatchers and more. One of the neatest things to see is parents bringing young to the feeders and teaching them to feed. The young shake their wings and scream at their parent "feed me, feed me".

March Nature Happenings

- March 1 31: Project FeederWatch continues
- March 14: Daylight Savings Time "spring forward"
- March 15: New Moon, March 29: Full Moon
- March 20: Vernal Equinox almost equal amounts of day and night
- Milkmaids, Buttercups, Bush Lupine, Golden Poppy, Miner's Lettuce, Wild Cucumber and many other wildflowers are in bloom.
- California Buckeyes bloom this month.
- House Wren, Warbling Vireo and Yellow Warblers return this month.
- American Pipits and Cedar Waxwings, our winter residents, depart for their breeding territories.
- Barn and Cliff Swallows return by mid-month.
- About 15% to 20% of our rain falls in March.
- Peak of spring waterfowl migration
- Bald Eagles and Screech Owls are sitting on their eggs.
- Bluebirds begin nesting by the end of the month. Be sure to have their nesting boxes ready.
- Goldfinches begin to molt into their brilliant yellow plumage.

They migrate through our area in the Spring. Most of the Rufous continue north. Some of the Allen's will nest locally. Our year round resident, Anna's, has already nested. They will nest again later this year.
