

1-2-3, How Many Birds Do You See?

Get ready to have some fun, count some birds and make a difference, because the 14th annual Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC) takes place February 18 through February 21.

Bird populations are dynamic; they are constantly in flux. No single scientist or team of scientists could hope to document the complex distribution and movements of so many species in such a short time. The GBBC is a chance for bird feeding enthusiasts like you to help scientists, and ultimately, help your birds.

Wild Birds Unlimited is a major sponsor of this joint project between the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, Bird Studies Canada and the National Audubon Society. There were more than 97,000 GBBC participants in 2010, and more are expected this year.

Anyone can participate. Simply watch and count birds in your yard, a nearby park, or maybe at a school. Then report what you saw by entering your bird list online at www.birdsource.org/gbbc.

GBBC data are used to alert scientists to particular species or questions that may require more detailed follow-up studies.

Your efforts help answer many questions:

- How will this winter's weather influence bird populations?
- Where are winter finches and other "irruptive" species that appear in large numbers during some years?
- How will the timing of birds' migrations compare with past years?
- Are any birds undergoing worrisome declines that point to the need for conservation attention?



Speaking of butterflies, one of the best things you can do to attract Monarch Butterflies is to plant native milkweed. Directly or indirectly, milkweed also nurtures bees, birds, beetles and

other insects. Now is the time to purchase and prepare milkweed seeds for planting by stratifying them. Our order of California Native Milkweed Seeds will be in the store soon.

Sounds complicated, but it isn't. Simply take your seeds, put them in a plastic sandwich bag with \(\frac{1}{4} \) cup horticultural sand and \(\frac{1}{4} \) teaspoon hot water,

swoosh around to mix, seal the bag and place it in the refrigerator. After 6 weeks, if no more frost is expected, they are ready to be planted. Since most native milkweeds are perennial, once they are established that first year, they will sprout on their own after




Other seeds you can start to entice butterflies (and you) into your garden: Parsley, Lovage, Oregano, Thyme, Lavender, Marjoram, Coneflowers (Echinacea), Borage, Hops, Sweet Violet, Nasturtium, Sage, Mints, Rosemary.....too many to mention. I can almost sense the gentle wind, the warmth of the sun and the wonderful smells wafting in from y(our) gardens.

- Look for conical-shaped balls of twigs and dead leaves in the canopy of oak and bay trees these are the new nests of Western Gray Sauirrels.
- Tree and Violet-green Swallows return this
- Look for hummingbirds visiting the cream-colored flowers of the California Bay Laurel Tree.
- Saucer Magnolia and Purple Leaf Flowering Plum bloom this month.
- Sandhill Cranes are migrating north.
